- Registered in December 1999 after working as an activist group since September 1999.
- Mission: protection of rights of women and children, assistance to people in crisis, those who suffer from abuse or witness violence

## **Key Areas of Work**

#### 1. Prevention

- educating youth on domestic violence, trafficking, human rights etc;
- trainings, seminars, roundtables for specialists;
- cooperation with mass media;
- cooperation with various stakeholders

### 2. Direct assistance to victims of trafficking and their families

- individual consultations
- reintegration monitoring
- assistance in employment
- psychological assistance, group therapy (co-ed; men; women)
- legal assistance, including restoration of documents
- facilitated education/ re-education
- ensuring victim's safety
- social escort/ case management
- provision of information on various social issues, contact information
- representation of victims is various situations
- assistance in restoring family connections

#### **Main achievements**

- 256 VoTs assisted in November 2005–October 2009, including 116 women and 140 men
- Around 190 trainings and seminars conducted for students of various ages
- 78 seminars/ trainings/ roundtables for specialists working in the sphere of counter-trafficking organized
- Membership in the Oblast Standing Commission for Coordination of counter-trafficking work affiliated with the Head of Sumy Oblast State Administration in
- Created a coalition of state agencies and NGOs for combating trafficking in persons in Sumy Oblast
- Signed cooperation agreements and established referral mechanism with
  - Sumy Oblast Division of the All-Ukrainian Network of Persons Living with HIV/AIDS
  - Vybir Charity (assistance to drug users and HIV-positive persons)
  - Krok Nazustrich Charity (assistance to women involved in sex business)
  - Ministry of Interior Counter-Trafficking Unit in Sumy Oblast
