David Cattler is the director of the Defense Combating Terrorism Center at the Defense Intelligence Agency, which is focused principally on terrorism-related warning, support to collection and military operations, and decision-making.

Mr. Cattler previously served as the Deputy Director for Intelligence, Joint Staff J2, and in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence as Principal Deputy National Intelligence Officer for Military Issues. In this capacity, he served as a senior advisor to the Director of National Intelligence (DNI) regarding military strategic, operational, tactical and technical developments worldwide. He also served as the DNI's Deputy Issue Topic Manager for Foreign Military Combat Capabilities and Advanced Conventional

Weapons and Proliferation. He joined the Senior National Intelligence Service in May 2007.

Mr. Cattler holds a Master of Policy Management degree from Georgetown University and Bachelor of Science degree in Political Science. He is a graduate of the National Intelligence University, the US Naval War College, and was a Senior Fellow at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Seminar XXI: Foreign Politics, International Relations and the National Interest.
